

## Map of a “Typical” Autocross Course at Dragway 42

The map is of a “typical” course set up at Dragway 42 for the ASCC Autocross. The set-up is different each event with this particular course just over a mile in length. As you can see, our courses are very much a “mini-road course” versus the “sea of cones” in the more typical autocross held in a parking lot.

Because of the length of the course, many of us use scooters to pre-walk the course before the race begins. Pre-walking is required if you do not want to get lost when on the course.

When you’re out pre-walking the course you’ll be looking for several things, first of all you’ll be simply looking to see where the course goes, how the corners are set up & where the cones direct you to drive.

You’ll also be making decisions about how you’ll approach & exit corners, slaloms, boxes and other “cone directed” obstacles. Slaloms can be “interesting” and are laid out on straights to reduce straightaway speed and usually require a decision on where you’ll want to enter, and thus exit, for the fastest time. As you get more experience you’ll add your own particulars to the list of what you’re looking for on the pre-walk.
